Objectives

The objectives of the program are as follows:

- Develop a network of emerging leaders and coaches/mentors to support their development.

This program will be held on Thursday 30th November and Friday 1st December at The Sebel Hotel, Launceston, commencing at 10.00 am to enable travel on Thursday morning.
